

... diversifies specialisation patterns that are more likely to boost economic prosperity.










Why clusters? SMEs are more innovative!

- cooperate more


Innovation is higher in clusters than elsewhere (a comparison with IB 2004)



What role for cluster organizations?






What role for cluster organisations?

- Provide <u>entrepreneurial support</u> to SMEs (e.g. coaching, vouchers, benchmarking)
- Act as <u>cross-border</u> bridge-builders (regional integration and international strategy)
- Act as catalyst for cross-sectorial collaborative projects
- Clusters create a favourable open space to promote value chain innovation via a <u>systemic approach</u>







Near-market demonstrators


A powerful means for de-risking the development and scale-up of novel service systems, encouraging engagement with stakeholders and users ...

- identifying clusters of expertise and opportunities for partnerships
- working back from user-needs to **solutions**
- moving from small-scale prototypes to larger-scale

Near-market cluster-led demonstrators

- Bringing together all relevant players (public and private), following a <u>user-driven</u> approach
- Testing a range of technological and service concept solutions under <u>near-market</u> conditions
- Moving from small-scale pilot projects to <u>large-scale</u> actions in real-life
- > Creating entrepreneurial opportunities for SMEs
- > Exploiting the transformative power of innovation to address societal challenges or specific problems



Ideas for an EU approach to SME clusters

Creation of a platform to facilitate actions engaging wordclass SME clusters towards the demonstration of new cross-regional and cross-sectoral value chains (emerging industries):

a. <u>Regional policy platform</u> for a coordinated orientation of clusters towards cross-sectorial innovation ("smart specialisation")

b. Near-market demonstrators to test and validate new value chains and business models in real-life conditions c. Internationalisation strategy for clusters/SMEs (European Strategic Cluster Partnerships)





Conclusions

- Using **cluster organisations** (and regional policies) to facilitate structural change and innovation



Cluster-led projects for new industrial value chains

INNOSUP 1

Call for proposals

Deadline early 2015 (stage 1)

~24.9mio 2015

5-10 projects expected

Topic builds on the experience of measures under Europe INNOVA under CIP and on studies from the European Cluster Observatory, such as on emerging industries.

Develop new business models and foster the development of emerging industries across the EU by better capitalising on the innovation potential of SMEs.

Cluster organisations or other SME intermediaries are invited to facilitate cross-sectorial and cross-border collaboration and to channel innovation support to SMEs.

Value chain innovation will be demonstrated in close-to-market conditions integrating many SMEs and through a systemic approach.



Cluster led projects for new industrial value chains

- 1. This **SME based and innovation oriented** scheme aims at demonstrating new industrial configurations in real-life conditions close to the market, by combining cross-sectorial competences and bringing innovation to new sectors.
- 2. A joint plan for the development of **new industrial value chains** shall be outlined by innovation players, involving a systemic approach for using the potential of SMEs & clusters.
- 3. At least 75% of the total budget shall be allocated to support innovation in **SMEs**.



Cluster led projects for new industrial value chains

- 4. Expected significant **impact** on business growth and capacity to **leverage** other support sources (either at the start and/or at the end of the project).
- 5. **Support** is foreseen via *Innovation Actions* for innovation and networking activities to validate new or emerging industrial approaches. The maximum funding rate of 70% applies except for non-profit legal entities, where a maximum of 100% applies.
- 6. The standard **eligibility criteria** apply (i.e. minimum of 3 "legal entities" from 3 different MS/AC) with an additional requirement to involve at least 3 cluster organisations or SME intermediaries (from 3 MS/AC) as facilitators.
